SCSA Awards Criteria

Corporate Leadership in Safety Award

The Corporate Leadership in Safety Award is presented to a member company in recognition of their dedication, outstanding contribution, commitment and leadership to support the SCSA's mission and vision in an effort to enhance health and safety in their workplace.



Eligibility

Nominee is an SCSA member company in residential, commercial & industrial, or construction trades.

Criteria

A successful nominee for this award:

- Promotes a high level of safety standards through a formal safety program.
- Identifies and controls health & safety concerns and/or hazards within the organization.
- Provides health & safety training, education and support to employees.
- Uses SCSA materials, resources and/or tools to enhance company safety practices.
- Holds corporate values around safety, encouraging employees to build positive safety culture.

Safety Leader Award

The SCSA presents the Safety Leader Award to an individual who shows leadership in the industry and is an employee of a member company. The award recognizes their leadership contributions, involvement in community activities, and dedication to advancing the mission and vision of the SCSA.

Eligibility

Nominee is a senior leader in an SCSA member company.

Criteria

A successful nominee for this award:

- Champions safety in their organization and influences others to build safety culture.
- Provides health & safety training or support to others, including mentoring or coaching.
- Demonstrates leadership in the construction community and participates in safety activities or events beyond their organization.
- Uses SCSA services, resources and/or tools to enhance company safety practices.

Safety Practitioner Award

The Safety Practitioner Award is presented to an individual who works for a member company and embodies the SCSA's mission and vision to create a healthy and safe workplace.

Eligibility

Nominee is employed by an SCSA member company.

Criteria

A successful nominee:

- Identifies and shares new safety topics, issues, suggestions, or ideas with their organization.
- Actively contributes to the promotion of a safer and healthier work environment.
- Shows dedication to pursuing continuous education around safety, through the SCSA and/or other sources.
