

Constructing Safety Leadership Awards Criteria

Corporate Leadership in Safety Award

Eligibility

Award nominee must be an SCSA member company.

Criteria

- Identifies health and safety concerns within the organization
- Involved in health and safety initiatives within their community
- Promotes a high level of safety standards within the company by creating and maintaining a safety program
- Provides health and safety training to employees. Consideration will be given to the use of all SCSA courses, as well as other in-house or outsourced courses
- Uses SCSA materials and resources to enhance company safety meetings (e.g. toolbox talks)

Safety Leader Award

Eligibility

Award nominee is a leader in a SCSA member company.

Criteria

- Shows leadership in industry initiatives that have safety as a priority (e.g. representation on a board of directors or other leadership roles)
- Demonstrates leadership in the construction industry
- Participates in community activities that contribute to a safer and healthier work environment
- Champions safety in their organization and is committed to promoting positive safety culture
- Involvement in industry indicators

Safety Practitioner Award

Eligibility

Award nominee must be employed by a SCSA member company.

Criteria

- Works as a field or office worker
- Identifies new safety topics, issues, suggestions, or ideas to their organization
- Demonstrates involvement in industry initiatives and/or other safety events and initiatives
- Actively contributes to the promotion of a safer and healthier work environment
- Shows dedication to pursuing continuous education around safety

- Top reasons for nominating the company or individual
- How the nominee supports core values of safety culture and increases safety awareness
- How the nominee uses technology to improve safety
- Certifications and any details that make them stand out from others
